What is NEOP?

The Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010 directed USDA to develop new regulations that transform SNAP-Ed into a Nutrition Education and Obesity Prevention (NEOP) grant program. In addition to a new focus on obesity, it adds allowances for community and public health approaches.
