Brief description of the program:

HEC's West Sacramento Housing Program works in collaboration with the West Sacramento Housing Development Corporation providing Economic support low-income and refugee families equipping them with the skills and resources to promote health and well-being.

Program description:

The West Sacramento Housing project will exclusively serve the West Sacramento community, specifically those living across six West Sacramento public housing communities. Communities are located within the oldest neighborhoods in West Sacramento, also known as the Bryte and Broderick neighborhoods in the city and home to almost 15,000 residents. In these communities, 28 percent of residents live below 100 percent of the Federal Poverty Level, almost double the city's average (U.S. Census Bureau, 2018). In light of the COVID19 pandemic, these West Sacramento communities have also been identified by the California Department of Public Health as low vaccination zones. This program aims to bring additional services and resources to individuals in these community that will help to reduce and prevent chronic disease, promote financial well-being and achieve greater health outcomes.
