- Attend program-based and professional development trainings as well as HEC meetings, as needed
- Assist in data collection and workshop curriculum development to support program deliverables.
- Provide weekly, monthly, and periodic reports to support program deliverables.
- Other duties, as assigned.

- Fluent in Ukrainian and Russian highly desired
- A passion for community, physical activity, and trauma-informed education
- Demonstrated skill in developing and maintaining interpersonal relationships and an ability to work with diverse communities
- Demonstrated written and public speaking communication skills, as well as critical thinking skills
- Basic computer knowledge (Microsoft Publisher, Power Point, Word, Excel)
- Ability to travel to and from all job related meetings, events, and activities
- Parent or guardian must attend a mandatory information session
- Availability to work afterschool and/or evenings and weekends.
